Advent

This year it is easy for Irish Catholics to share in the cry for help expressed in the responsorial psalm in today's Mass: "God of hosts, bring us back;

Let your face shine on us and we shall be saved.

O Lord, rouse up your might,

O Lord, come to our help."

Our Church is under relentless attack. Religious practice has waned alarmingly. The numbers left in priestly ministry is near crisis point. Vocations have all but disappeared.

Over the centuries the Church has been through good times and bad. Even in the Old Testament times, God's people experienced moments, even decades, of despair. Dip into any book of the Bible and you will read the cries of the Prophets lamenting the lapses of the chosen race: true worship has declined, foreign influences have lured believers away from the true God, corruption reigns in the land, God's enemies are triumphant, false gods are worshipped and the Temple is in ruins. But the flame of faith never went out. There was always a remnant of God's chosen people who soldiered on in the face of adversity, persecution and ridicule. What inspired them was the promise of a Redeemer first made by God after Man's Fall and repeated to Abraham, Moses and David. The birth of Jesus marked the fulfilment of that ancient promise. By then only a handful of believers remained. Even when Jesus proclaimed his mission and proved it with his miracles and his resurrection the public remained unconvinced, uninterested, even hostile.

Statistics, opinion polls, expert analysis if they had existed on the first Christmas Night would have given the newly born Redeemer zero chance of success in his mission. "Who do you think will triumph, Jesus or Caesar?". The "vox pop" would have endorsed Caesar and his huge Roman Empire and consigned the Infant of Bethlehem to oblivion. How short sighted can human wisdom be!

Let us put our hearts in the words: God of hosts, turn again, we implore, look down from heaven and see.

And we shall never forsake you again.

5 Thursday Is. 26:1-6. Ps.117. Mt. 7:21,24-27. Lect I:19 6 Friday Is. 29:17-24. Ps.26. Mt. 9:27-31. Lect I:20 St. Nicholas of Myra, a fourth-century bishop in Turkey, of whom

little is known. He is patron of Russia, of sailors, of pawnbrokers and of children.

7 Saturday Is. 30:19-21, 23-26. Ps.146. Mt. 9:35-10:1, 6-8. *Lect 1*:22. St Ambrose, 339-397, became governor of the Roman Province whose seat was in Milan. In 374, the laity insisted on his becoming bishop though he was still not baptised. He defended orthodoxy in brilliant preaching. Patron of Milan, beekeepers, domestic animals.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

FIRST READING: ISAIAH 63: 16-17; 64:1, 3-8 Written hundreds of years before Christ this prophetic passage stresses the Fatherhood of God. It foreshadows the "Our Father" of the Gospel. Sin takes away a peoples' strength, makes them like faded leaves before the wind. God is asked to return and glorify His name by saving his people.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9 Corinth occupied the site of an old Greek city, famous for its commerce, its pottery and fine bronze work and notorious for its luxury and immorality. That city was destroyed and a century later a new city was built, colonised by Romans. Paul converted Jews and pagans there but when he moved on disputes broke out among the converts. Hence this letter in which he tries to bring them back to their first fervour and harmony.

GOSPEL: Mark. 13: 33-37.

Because the time of Christ's coming in judgement is not revealed, constant readiness is necessary. This warning is not meant for the Apostles alone but for all people at all times. However it is important to realise that Christ is not a dealer in death but rather one who comes to give us life a new form of life which can never be threatened by death.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

December 3rd - ST. FRANCIS XAVIER St. Francis Xavier: 1506-1552, one of the first seven Jesuits. He was sent to India by St Ignatius. It is extraordinary that one man in the space of ten years could have visited so many countries, preached the Gospel to so many nations and converted so many infidels. His initial journey from Lisbon to Goa in a sailing ship was in itself a tremendous undertaking. From India he travelled on to the island of Ceylon. In 1549 Francis Xavier landed in Japan where he spent a year learning the language. When he was able to express himself he began preaching Christianity but the political authorities had him expelled from the city. Bravely he continued to preach in other Japanese cities and towns building up the nucleus of a Christian community. During this time he heard much of the Celestial Empire of China and eventually he arrived on a small island off the coast of that great empire. While planning the best means of reaching the mainland he was taken ill and died in a rude hut built to shelter him. In these wretched surroundings, the greatest missionary since St. Paul passed to his reward.
