Feast of All Saints

We trust that our loved ones, relations and friends are among those who are now enjoying the glory and happiness of being face to face with God.

The saints we celebrate were men and women like us. Perhaps we may sometimes think of our departed loved ones as being dead and gone. But our faith helps us to believe that they are alive now more than ever, because they are now fully alive in God. The life they now enjoy can no longer be touched by sickness, suffering, sin, or death. We thank God for all those whom he has already welcomed to heaven. During November we pray especially for those who are still being purified in Purgatory knowing that our prayers can help them.

The Second Reading from the First Letter of St John, reminds us of the great love of God who already has chosen to call us His children."What we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed, we will be like him, because we will see him as he is."

The Beatitudes in today's Gospel, propose to us a way of life, inviting us to be poor in spirit, that is relying on God to help us through life, to identify with the meek, those who mourn, and those who hunger and thirst after justice. They challenge us to be compassionate people, to be men and women who are pure in heart, and to become peacemakers in our dealings with one another, in our families and in society at large, even when this entails ridicule and persecution. We pray for faith and courage to walk this journey. The saints encourage us in our day to day struggles because like us they also endured struggles. Our Faith assures us that all who respond to the Lord's invitation to live the life of the Beatitudes will one day hear those welcoming and consoling words, "Well done, good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Lord"

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Apoc. 7:2-4, 9-14

In commemorating all the saints in heaven we give thanks to God for the inspiration which their witness continues to give us. Though not known to us by name, these are the women and men who showed perseverance and trust in their pilgrim journey of faith. Far from fleeing in the face of challenge, they faced difficulty with confidence and hope and now rejoice in God's presence for ever.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-3

John reminds us of our identity as children of a God who is lavish with his gifts. We are asked to hold fast to the hope contained in God's promise to us. As we journey together towards our heavenly home, we are strengthened in the knowledge that he is with us guiding us, perfecting us, preparing us for a destiny which is beyond our wildest imaginings.

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12

The first three words in today's Gospel passage provide us with the key to understanding why Jesus climbed the hill and began to teach: 'seeing the crowds ...' In the Scriptures, the image of sight is often used to describe not just the physical act of looking at and recognising someone or something but also — and at a more profound level —'seeing' describes spiritual insight. When Jesus looks at us, he sees as God sees. He recognises our need. He speaks words of life to us. He enlivens our hearts with hope and he helps us to see that the poor, humble, little ones of the earth are those who will inherit the kingdom of heaven.


