SEARCHING FOR GOD

In one of his many plays, Padraig Pearse tells the story of Sean of Mac Dara, the singer who returns home and tells his old school teacher Maoilsheachlainn about his loss of faith. "Once, as I knelt by the cross of Kilgobbin, it became clear to me with an awful clearness, that there was no God. Why pray after that? I burst into a fit of laughter at the foolishness of men in thinking that there is a God. I felt inclined to run through the villages and cry aloud, "People, it is all a mistake. There is no God..." Then I said, "Why take away their illusion? If they find out that there is no God, their hearts will be as lonely as mine", so I walked the roads with my secret." To which Maoilsheachlainn replied, "Mac Dara, I am sorry for this. You must pray. You must pray. You will find God again. He has only hidden his face from you."

"No" said Mac Dara, "He has revealed his face to me....the people, Maoilsheachlainn, the dumb, suffering people...... In them I saw or seemed to see again, the face of God."

In the people and his concern that his unbelief might disturb their simple faith, Mac Dara rediscovered the face of God.

Today, many people are looking, looking for a God whom they can touch and see and feel, in other words an experience of God. May the Lord help all who are searching at this time.



2 Sunday Mal 3:1-4. Ps. 23. Heb. 2i14-18. Lk. 2:22-40.Lect II:940 23 Monday Mal. 3:1-4, 4:5-6. Ps. 24. Lk. 1 :57-66. Lect I:90 The Presentation of the Lord. This feast is a combined remembrance of the Son and the Mother." Ceremonial of Bishops, N. 241 "On this day Christ's faithful people, with candles in their hands, go out to meet the Lord and to acclaim him with Simeon, who recognised Christ as 'a light to reveal God to the nations'. They should therefore be taught to walk as children of the light in their entire way of life, because they have a duty to show the light of Christ to all by acting in the works that they do as lighted lamps.

Lect II:47 Sts Paul Miki & Companions martyred at Nagasaki, Japan, in 1597. The 6 franciscans, 17 Franciscan Tertiaries, and 3 Jesuits died suspended on crosses.

7 Friday Heb.13:1 -8. Ps. 26. Mk. 6:14-29. Lect II: 49 St Mel is said to have been a Briton who came to Ireland with St Patrick and with whom he worked until he was ordained in Ardagh,488.

8 Saturday Heb. 13:15-17. Ps. 22. Mk. 6:30-34. Lect II:51 St Jerome Emiliani, d. 1537, converted in later life after a military career he founded the Clerks Regular of Somascha far the care of orphans and the poor. Patron saint of orphans.

Saint JOSEPHINE BAKHITA

Born in 1868 to a wealthy Sudanese family, she was kidnapped by slave-traders at age 9, and given the name Bakbita which means Lucky One) by them. Sold and resold in the markets at El Obeid and Khartoum, and enduring much ill-treatment finally purchased in 1883 by Callisto Legnani, Italian consul, who planned to free her. She accompanied Legnani to Italy in 1885, and worked for the family of Augusto Michieli as nanny. She was treated well in Italy, and grew to lave the country. She became a Christian on 9 January 1890 and took the name of Josephine as a symbol of her new life. I received the Sacrament of Baptism with such joy that only angels could describe." She entered the Institute of Canossian Daughters of Charity in Venice 1893, and served as a Canossian Sister for the next fifty years. Her gentle presence, her warm, amiable voice, and her willingness to help with any menial task were a comfort to the poor and suffering people who came to the door of the Institute. After a biography of her was published in 1930, she became a noted and sought after speaker, raising funds to support missions. Died 8 February 1947 of natural causes in Italy Canonised 1 October 2000



THE SUNDAY READINGS

FIRST READING: Malachi 3: 1-4 God's people were complaining that their oppressors were prospering while they were left to suffer. "If God is just", they asked. "Where is He?" God answers that he will come but that they are not fit to receive his coming. He will have to purify them like gold is purified in fire before they will be fit to serve the Lord.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 2: 14-18 Christ did not come to help immortal angels but mortal men. As helper of mortals he had to resemble them in every possible way so as to become merciful by partnership in misery. Experience of suffering and of trial is the best school of compassion. Knowing pain and trial, Christ is a competent helper of those who are being tried.

GOSPEL: Luke 2: 22-40

As in the case of the birth of Jesus the narrative of Luke is marked with great simplicity. The precise prescriptions of the Law are followed. As the firstborn, Jesus is God's property, consecrated to God as in a sacrifice. Mary offers what was known as "the poor woman's sacrifice": two young pigeons. The future of the Child is foretold by the two old people, Simeon and Anna. Luke, in one brief le sentence, passes over the first twelve years of the life of Jesus: "he grew to maturity and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him.

SAINT OF THE WEEK 3rd - FEBRUARY - 03

ST BLAISE

According to legend St. Blaise was a physician at Sebaste, Armenia, before he became the Bishop of that See. Accounts of his life place his martyrdom in the year 316. At the time of the persecution he was taken prisoner at the command of the Governor, Agricolaus. The hunters of the Governor found him in the wilderness in a cave to which he had retired. While in prison he performed a wonderful cure on a boy who had a fishbone in his throat and who was in danger of choking to death. After suffering various forms of torture, St. Blaise was beheaded.

The veneration of the saint was brought into western Europe at an early date and he became one of the most popular saints of the Middle Ages. On the day of his feast a special blessing is given: two candles are held in a crossed position beneath the throat of the recipient and a special prayer for protection against diseases of the throat is said.
