The sacrifice of Christ re-united us with Christ, once for all. Every time we celebrate the Lord's Supper and receive his body and blood then through him our union with God is renewed.

#### **RESPECT FOR ALL**

Some years ago while travelling to the United States, I found myself seated beside an elderly lady. It was her first time out of Ireland and also her first flight. She was both nervous and excited and we engaged in conversation for the entire duration of the six and a half hour flight to Boston. I found her interesting, in fact quite fascinating, especially her attitude to life. Her approach to people was quite impressive. On arrival at Logan Airport at the end of a seemingly very short plane journey, I asked her what advice she could give me drawing on her own long experience of both people and life itself. As we moved through baggage and customs clearance she paused and turned to me and said " Always have respect for people. It was perhaps the greatest lesson that I learned from my parents".

Those memorable words floated back to me recently when on a walk downtown in Patrick St. I listened to racist and nasty remarks that were being uttered, within my hearing, at a few of our new immigrants as they walked along the street. Time and time again in the Bible, we are reminded of the respect we must have for God and for all of God's people, regardless of Race, Creed or Colour. We must also have respect for the things of this world and not be too preoccupied with them.

When we respect and honour God then we are also honouring God's people. We cannot separate God from his people.

How do we show respect to God? We must give witness to him by our lives. Do we? We must act like him, not only in our words and in what we say, but more especially in our actions.

In the time of Moses we read in the old testament that he was having problems with his people and he appeals to God for help. God shows favour to some people by giving them gifts like that of prophecy and of course the jealousy of others is aroused when they do not receive these gifts. Is it not true of ourselves even in this present time! God's gifts are not limited to ourselves as Irish people but are given to the many others, of

different race, creed and colour, who are living in our midst at this present time. God is Lord of all the nations, of all peoples. Do we, I wonder, appreciate all that God has done for us in our lives and is doing at this present time?

It seems to be an inborn instinct in us to mistrust and sometimes reject people who are different from us. Are we not biased and narrowminded at times even towards those who are close to us, our own families and friends? Do we always show respect to them? The very same thing

happened to Our Lord. In the Gospel we are told that "Jesus came to his own and yet his own did not accept him." He was different. In his hometown of Nazareth the people even became hostile, they found him too much for them

Today then, let us look more deeply at our own lives. Let us examine our conscience in relation to our way of life. Do we behave in a way that is pleasing to God? Do we show our respect to God? Let us pray that we will respond to all those in our midst, of all race, creed and colour, in the Christlike way by showing our respect for all.

**3 Monday- St Kevin** was a native of Leinster and grew up in Kilnamanagh, where he received his early religious formation. Wishing to be a hermit, he crossed the mountains to Glendalough and settled in Disert Caoimhghin at the foot of the upper lake. But disciples began to gather round him. Gradually the great monastic settlement grew, and spread through the glen after his death in 618.

**4 Tuesday - Sts Charles Lwanga and companions** - 22 Ugandan youths martyred in 1886


**5 Wednesday - St. Boniface** 673-754. was born at Crediton in Devonshire and educated in monastery schools in England. He went as a missionary to Germany. He founded monasteries in Bavaria, that of Fulda in 735.

**6 Thursday - St. Jarlath** is said to have been a disciple of St Enda, and was taught also by St Benigus. He became abbot-bishop of the monastery he founded at Tuam in the 6th century.

their devotion.


It is therefore desirable to continue this procession where circumstances permit and when it can truly be a sign of common faith and adoration..."


