During the week we had our Third Confirmation Day in the parish and next week we will have our Final Confirmation Day for the boys of Scoil Eoin. While up at the home place during the week I saw families gathering with neighbours as they paid a special visit to loved ones and friends. Confirmation Day usually conjures up vivid memories of our own day of Confirmation. As young people we gathered with our parents, teachers, religious and priests with excitement and the energy of young life. All the reflections concerning the gifts of the Spirit and the Third Person of the Trinity would have been explored and examined and prayed about. Indeed I recently took the opportunity to reflect and ask a couple of questions about what happens at Confirmation and what is our understanding of the activity and presence of the Holy Spirit.

In simple terms while we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit at Baptism there is a calling forth of that same Spirit to enable young people and those Confirmed to be strong and courageous witnesses to their faith, to Christ, to the Gospels. "Strong and perfect Christians."

The anointing with the sacramental oil of chrism confers a grace upon the Confirmed to enable them to be close to God as they move towards adulthood and a more mature Christian and human response to all aspects of the journey of life. Isn't that what discipleship is about?

Quoting from St Paul's Missal for today

"to be a disciple of Jesus means one who is learning. The way one learns from another is by observing what they do, by trying to capture some of the spirit which animates them, in short, by being with them."

And this is precisely what the image of the vine and the branches intends to convey, namely, that it is by keeping company with the Lord, we develop and grow as followers of his.

As we hear Jesus say to the disciples of His time and unto us, from the youngest to the eldest,

"Make your home in me, as I make mine in you.

As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself,

but must remain part of the vine,

neither can you unless you remain in me."

we invite the Spirit of God to bless us and we invite God's Holy Spirit to be our guide always on our pilgrim way.

THE SUNDAY READINGS**First Reading: Acts 9: 26-31**

When St. Stephen was stoned to death because of his preaching Paul (then known as Saul) was in charge of the execution. Now, however, after his conversion on the road to Damascus, he returns to Jerusalem and takes up where Stephen left off: preaching the same message. Again this preaching arouses the same fury and the Disciples, fearing for his life, sent him away to his home town of Tarsus.

Second Reading: 1 John 3: 18-24

Love of God and of the neighbour are inseparable. In practising either we must not rest satisfied with expressions of devotion and good will. Only when charity is active does conscience assure us that we are leading sincere Christian lives. Two things sum up what is most pleasing to God; faith in the divine personality of Jesus Christ and brotherly love according to Christ's instructions.

Gospel: John 15: 1-8

In this allegory the cultivation of the vine is attributed to God the Father. A fruitless branch is lopped off like Judas. The pruning clean of the Apostles is the result of the words Jesus spoke to them. A separated vine branch is useless. It is destined for the fire. Fruitfulness and discipleship go together.

and know people from our community.**Experiencing Grief and Loss**

No amount of knowledge can prepare us for the death of a loved one. Grief is the most intense emotion we can experience and each one's journey through it is personal /different. Grief can absorb all our energy, affecting all areas of one's life, physically, emotionally, spiritually. One may feel physically and emotionally drained. Other normal reactions may be difficulty sleeping; loss of concentration; loss of motivation or interest in things that were once enjoyable. It may be a struggle to do everyday things, like cooking, going to work, shopping and meeting people. We may experience anxiety, isolation, and fear. Because it can be difficult to name or talk about these feelings, we may be inclined to isolate ourselves. These reactions are a normal part of grief and loss and it does help to talk about them with someone you trust. While we may even feel God has abandoned us, yet He is there with us. We pray for comfort and strength for all who are grieving today and who struggle with the many feelings and questions surrounding the death of a loved one.
