The Cork County Community Games Swimming Finals were held at the Leisure World Complex in Bishopstown. Ballincollig were represented in a number of events, and got off to a great start when nine year old Niamh O'Connor won her heat in the Girls U/10 Freestyle event. Other Ballincollig qualifiers for the finals were Jane Lucey in the Girls U/16 Butterfly, Fiona Hedderman in the Girls U/16 Backstroke and Richard O'Reilly in the Boys U/10 Backstroke. Other Ballincollig swimmers to perform creditably were Michelle and Gavin Hennigan and Conor Wall.

In the finals Niamh reproduced the form she showed in the heats and won in fine style. It is the first time since 1997 that Ballincollig has had a swimmer so young qualify for the National Finals in Mosney. In the U/16 grade Fiona Hedderman won the Backstroke and qualified for the National Finals for her **third time**. Jane Lucey swam exceptionally well to win the Bronze Medal in the 50m Butterfly.

On Bank Holiday Monday the Ballincollig area Gymnastic finals will be held at the Ballincollig Gymnastics Club on the Link Road starting at 6.00 pm. The events will begin with the U/8's and U/10's. To ensure the events run smoothly and on time, it would be appreciated if the contestants would be ready to register and warm-up at 5.30 pm.

Grounds on Saturday next 10th, and on the following day Sunday 11th the Girls Basketball finals will be played in Little Island. THE SUNDAY READINGS

FIRST READING: Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19

In this speech to the Jews, St. Peter aims primarily that Our Lord is the Messiah whose sufferings were foretold by the Prophet Messiah. He wishes to prove that Jesus, in spite of his crucifixion was the Messiah. Peter consoles the Jews with the thought that they had no idea as to whom they were putting to death. Now, however, they are being told so the time has come for them to ask forgiveness for their sins.

SECOND READING: 1 John 2: 1-5

The Apostle urges his readers to be very careful to avoid sin; yet he knows the weakness of human nature and holds out the hope of pardon to the sinner because we have an advocate with the Father, one who intercedes for us and for the whole world. Christ exercises this office of advocate for sinners by continually offering the merits of his passion and death on their behalf.

GOSPEL: Luke 24: 35-48

When Luke set out to write his Gospel he said that he would put all things 'in order'. With these last words of Jesus he welds together what was foretold in Scripture with the mission of the Apostles in the future. Christ had to suffer for the sins of men but as the Messiah he had to rise again and give to the Apostles the power to forgive sins and bring liberation to mankind.

On the 9th of November 2002 Mick O'Connell set out with the Dolphin Senior Team for a Charity Cup match in Clonakilty.

Spirits were high; as Dolphin had won their first two AIL games, their best start in years. Little did we know that a freak accident was about to happen and Mick would suffer serious spinal injuries that would change his life and that of his family forever?

Mick was taken to the Cork University Hospital where he was operated on that evening, but his condition deteriorated within a week, due to internal bleeding and pneumonia, which left him fighting for his life for the next two months.

He lost nearly 6 stone in weight during that time, thankfully by the 22nd of January Mick's condition had improved significantly to allow him to be transferred to the National Rehabilitation Centre in Dun Laoghaire where intensive remedial treatment began and he is gradually putting on weight and getting stronger day by day.

There is nothing we can do in respect to Mick's injuries except for our prayers but we can help in removing the financial challenges to ensure that he can have a future where his long-term needs are catered for, whatever they may be.

A Sponsored 5K Run/Walk will take place on Sunday the 11^{th} of May, 2003 where each participant will be asked to raise a minimum sponsorship of $\in 100.00$. There is of course no maximum to what you can collect or donate.
