#### **STARTING AFRESH**

The ship on which he had booked his passage was lying in the blue harbour ready to sail. On board were the missionary's books and possessions. Only Raimon Lull himself was not there. He was facing the hardest moment of his life. Though he knew the ship was waiting for him he could not leave his room in the town. For suddenly he had felt terribly afraid. He sat there alone, thinking of the unknown country to which he was going, of the fierce Saracens who had just triumphed over the Crusaders in Palestine and were bitterly angry because their brother Moors had been slain in Spain by Crusaders like Raimon's father. For the moment he forgot the real reason why he was sailing to meet these fierce and cruel men; he thought only of what they might do to him. Perhaps they would torture him or keep him imprisoned for life in a dark dungeon. No, he simply could not go. So his belongings were brought ashore again. The boat sailed without him.

Feeling that he had failed his Master, Raimon Lull's shame and sorrow were so great that he became very ill with a high fever. But his courage was beginning to come back. When his friends brought him news that another ship was ready in the harbour and loaded to sail for the port of Tunis, he begged them to put his books on board and to carry him down to the ship. They did as he asked, but seeing how ill he was they carried him ashore again, in spite of all his pleading, just before the hour of sailing.

Soon came the news of a third ship that was making ready to sail, and Raimon Lull made up his mind that at all costs he would be put on board and would sail this time. As the ship sailed out of the harbour into the open sea, Lull felt the courage of Christ take hold of him in place of the old fears. "From this moment," he wrote, "I was a new man. All fever left me almost before we were out of sight of land." So the ship sailed southward to the great Muslim city of Tunis.

#### THE SUNDAY READINGS

#### FIRST READING: Jeremiah 31: 31-34

The prophet foretells the day when a new covenant will be made between God and man. Christ will be the new High Priest. Before him all men will be equal and the different religious beliefs will one day disappear, as all men will come to know the one true God.

#### SECOND READING: Hebrews 5: 7-9

Gethsemane rather than Calvary is the scene here. Christ is presented in his weakness. Nowhere was Jesus more evidently one of our weak human selves than in the garden of Gethsemane where he suffered his agony of anticipation. Being innocent he could not offer sacrifice for his own sins like the High Priests in the Old Testament but he could pray out of the anguish of mortal weakness which he took on for our salvation.

#### GOSPEL: John 12: 20-30

The grain of wheat has life in it but that does not germinate into the production of other living grains unless it is subject to death and burial in the ground. Martyrdom is the highest act of self-denial. The cross frightens us, but it also frightened Jesus. The vivid image of a cruel death brought to Jesus a tremor of fear. Crucified, he will draw all people, without distinction of race, to himself.

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. John Baptist De La Salle 07-April-2003

The De La Salle Brothers are well known in schools in Ireland where they have taught for many years. Macroom, Skibbereen and Dungarvan are towns where this Religious Order has made an enormous contribution in the last century. As members of a French Order, the De La Salle Brothers brought a European outlook to an Ireland that was culturally boxed in by America on one side and Britain on the other.

The teaching order was founded by St. John Baptist De La Salle, himself a French nobleman. He revolutionized the system of elementary education in his day: substituting the vernacular for Latin, grouping the boys in classes, insisting on silence during lessons. Having inherited a large fortune, he gave it all away to the poor. "It is not a sin to have money, but it is a sin to fix our hearts upon money."
