November

Starting with All Souls' Day on 2nd November, this is the month when we remember and pray for our dead. We experience again the grief and loneliness, and we remember good times and bad, the joys and sorrows. At the last supper Jesus asked that his friends remember him, he gave them the bread and the wine saying: "this is my body, this is my blood, do this in memory of me." We remember these words at the Consecration of each Mass. He died for all and we pray for our dead at each Mass, not just in November. The young men described in today's first reading from the second book of Maccabees had an absolute confidence that God will raise them to live again for ever. We remember our dead in the context of our own sure and certain hope of eternal life for them and for us. When we think of our own death may we pray with the Psalmist: "I shall be filled when I awake with the sight of your glory, O Lord."

As Christians we are called to share Christ's roles as priest, prophet and king; making spiritual sacrifices, witnessing to his truth by our lives, and sharing the kingship of the servant king as we serve our brothers and sisters and especially God's little ones. We seek to follow Christ as his disciples, though living the Christian life in an age of scepticism and growing disbelief is not easy. With Paul we pray that the Lord will turn our hearts to the love of God and the fortitude of Christ. The Lord gives us the strength to live his truth, he gives us comfort and strength in the face of opposition and so his word spreads. Jesus met a fair amount of disbelief and opposition in his own time, the question put to him about the widow of the seven brothers was intended to trap him. In his reply Jesus explains something of the nature of eternal life. He assures us in relation to those for whom we grieve that God is a God not of the dead but of the living, and to him all people are in fact alive.

We pray therefore that our beloved dead are among those of whom it is said: "They shall see the Lord face to face and his name will be written on their foreheads. It will never be night again and they will not need lamplight or sunlight, because the Lord God will be shining on them. They will reign for ever and ever."

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14

The Maccabees were Jewish young men who died for their faith. They knew there would be a resurrection, and they were not afraid to die.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 2:16 - 3:5 In the second reading, we remember that Christ's return is near. God will give strength, and so for us the future holds no fear.

Gospel: Luke 20-27-38

At the time Jesus lived, not everyone believed in resurrection. The Sadducees especially resisted the idea and tried to make Jesus look foolish when they asked who would be the man's wife in heaven. They posed a situation where a woman's husband died. As was the custom of the time, the brother of a deceased man married the widow in order to insure heirs. They predicted that hypothetically if enough husbands died, she could meet seven husbands at her own resurrection. Which one would be her husband in heaven, they wondered? Neither we nor the Sadducees can fully understand life after death, but Jesus asks us to trust that something much greater than our understanding awaits us at the resurrection

Tension Awareness

Work off your anger...

If you feel yourself using anger as a general way of behaviour, remember that while anger may give you a temporary sense of righteousness, or even of power, it will generally leave you feeling or looking rather foolish. If you feel like lashing out at someone who has provoked you, try curbing the impulse. Instead try to do something constructive with the pent-up energy – try some physical activity like gardening, DIY, sport or going for a walk.
