Christian Love

Our Christian calling involves service to others, to each other. This is often worked out in a home or family context, as well as in the wider community. In the face of human suffering and need, we are called to share each other' burdens. In meeting the needs of others in Christian service, our lives are enriched and given deeper meaning. In today's second reading St Paul tells us that he made himself the slave of all. Our service to one another is focussed on the other, not on ourselves. Paul tells us that he became all things to all men, in other words, he met people where they were, empathising with them and showing genuine friendliness and Christian love, seeking a shared perspective. In this he showed respect for those he served, and as we know he was willing to accept help in his own need also.

In Peter's mother-on-law we see the example of serving in terms of hospitality, an honoured and noble task in the ancient world, and still today seen as a sign of openhearted generosity. Jesus, who came to serve, washed the feet of his disciples saying "I have given you an example so that you may copy what I have done to you." We are called to follow Christ who came not to be served, but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many. In a healthy Christian community the various need of people are met by the giftedness, by the talents and abilities of many within that community.

There are many ways in which we can serve, and many different talents and abilities among us. And there is always plenty of scope for service in terms of human needs and suffering. We have in Ballincollig a large number of groups of people who combine to provide service to the Christian community or to individuals, including for example members of the Society of St Vincent de Paul, church music groups and others who help or minister in our churches and the many involved in social, cultural and sporting activities in a voluntary capacity, helping to build up a vibrant parish community.

It is in prayer that we find the strength to persevere in our Christian service, and to keep it fresh and generous. In this we follow the example of Jesus who turned to his Father in prayer to find the strength for his mission. We pray that we in our service may continue be the instruments of the God who heals the broken hearted, as we seek to bring light and peace into the darkness of our world.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Job 7: 1-4. 6-7

The Book of Job takes us to the depth of human suffering – even to the depths of despair.

Second Reading: 1 Cor. 9: 16-19, 22-23

St. Paul tells of his enthusiasm for preaching the gospel.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

We learn several important pieces of information from this gospel passage. First, Simon Peter had a mother-in-law. When we read previously that he left his fishing boat to follow Jesus, we can safely assume that he left much more than that. He had a family at home and we hear in this gospel of Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law. Also, this gospel helps us recognise the need Jesus had to be away from the crowds and confusion to take time to pray and become revitalised and strengthened for his ministry.

Ballincollig Parish

Year of St. Paul 2008 - 2009

The Pope has encouraged local church communities and believers to use this year as an opportunity to learn about the life of Paul, to study his writings and thereby to allow our faith to be revitalised in the light of his life and teachings. The letters of St. Paul were the very first books of the New Testament to be written and so offer a unique insight into the beginnings of the Church and how the first believers understood the meaning of the life and death of Jesus in their own lives.

To celebrate the Year of St Paul in Ballincollig, information leaflets introducing the life and letters of Paul the Apostle prepared by Fr Sean O'Sullivan of the Office of Adult Religious Education of the Diocese of Cork & Ross by will be presented during a series of eight talks from now to November. The meetings will be held in the St Mark Centre, opposite the Church of Christ Our Light in Innishmore. These will include presentation of the material by Fr Billy O'Sullivan followed by tea and group discussion. Copies of the information leaflets will be available for everybody. 
