#### **LEGIONARIES ON A MISSION**

In the Bible the book known as "The Acts of the Apostles" comes immediately after the Gospel according to St. John. In these weeks after Easter some of the Readings at Mass are taken from The Acts. This inspired book is by far the most readable in the whole Bible. Full of the energy and urgency that motivated the early Christians, the story covers vast areas of the Mediterranean world from Jerusalem to Rome, from Greece to Turkey. Malta is the setting for what is, perhaps, the best account of a shipwreck in ancient literature (chapter 27)

Fearlessness characterised the early messengers of the Christian Faith. That spirit still motivates Christian missionaries who travel to distant lands with the good news of salvation. Recently members of the Legion of Mary in Cork, (including some from Ballincollig), motivated by the same evangelical spirit went to Coventry on a mission.

The 12 Cork Legionaries went to the parish of St. Elizabeth, Eld Rd., Coventry, to carry out house visitation. The parish is located in an area of the city often neglected by the Council. Much of the housing is run down; business interests are limited and the standard of public health is poor, especially among the predominantly Asian community. The recent influx of Asylum Seekers and Refugees has changed the ethnic mix once again. The estimated Catholic population is 2,500, of whom 600 practice.

The Legion team was accommodated in the parish house and private homes. Eight Coventry Legionaries helped out in the visitation of homes. Over 3,000 homes were visited. 154 practising Catholic were encountered, 171 lapsed Catholics, 11 who showed an interest in the Faith. Some case histories illustrate the challenging nature of the work.

- 1) Little girl came to the door and said no Catholics here, but a young man came out and said "I'm a Catholic" and brought them in. His mother was there and she was lapsed. She had three other children, not bapitsed. She promised to contact the Priest. The boy was overjoyed when given a Rosary.
- 2) Lady from Uganda invited the Legionaries in and said she was a Catholic. She was a nurse whose husband had left her with 3 daughters. She came to the Presbytery, met the Priest and came to Mass on Saturday morning.
- 3) Italian Lady came to Mass on Friday. Possibly, she may return to the Faith.
- 4) A Hindu lady asked for medals for her five sons.

Such missionary work is surely in the tradition of the followers of Jesus who faced the indifference and hostility of the Roman World and eventually conquered it for the Lord.

#### THE SUNDAY READINGS

FIRST READING: Acts 2: 1-11

You will notice the phrases "what sounded like a powerful wind", "something that seemed like tongues of fire". This is not an exact visual description of the Holy Spirit. John is speaking in symbols. Fire symbolised the power and the presence of God. The wind is a symbol of the Holy Spirit who would soon disperse the little group to the four corners of the world. Writing of the miracle of Pentecost, when the Apostles spoke in many languages, the early Christian writers drew the parallel between the tower of Babel when God confused languages to punish mankind for their pride and Pentecost when the Spirit of God brought all to unity again.

SECOND READING: Galatians 5: 16-25

The old Law of the Bible was mainly negative. Do not do this or that. Christian liberty is positive. It encourages us to go way beyond the Law and sets no limits to the good we can do in our lives. If we follow the Spirit and follow His promptings we will achieve complete victory over ourselves.

GOSPEL: John 15: 26-27; 16:12-15

The Holy Spirit is a real person distinct from the Father and the Son. Towards the world he is an accuser from whom there is no escape. Towards the Apostles he is Christ's great substitute to guide them into all religious truth. Bitter critics of the Church should remember that they are attacking a Church that will have as its guide the Holy Spirit for ever.

# SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Anthony of Padua 13-June-2003

Men closed their shops and offices to go to the sermons of Saint Anthony; women rose early or remained overnight in church to secure their places. Often the churches could not hold the congregations and Anthony preached to them in the squares and marketsplaces. The custom of invoking Anthony to find lost articles may have arisen from this incident: a novice ran away, carrying off a valuable Psalter Anthony was using. Anthony prayed for its recovery and the novice was compelled by an alarming apparition to come back and return the Psalter.
