What a pity that for many the Trinity is just an intellectual puzzle! For the believer it is a sign of how close God has come to us by revealing (but not reducing) the mystery of his Being. He draws us into the mystery making us his children by the gift of the Spirit.

Trinity Sunday

Today the Church invites us to celebrate the mystery of the Trinity. We begin and end each Mass with the names of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit on our lips.

The Blessed Trinity is one of the difficult areas of the Christian belief to understand. If, indeed, "understand" is the right word to use. The way that St. Patrick is thought to have passed on the idea of the Trinity, with the use of the three leaves of the shamrock, is probable the best known attempt to explain what in our minds is just impossible to explain. Three is simply not the same as One in this world, and can never be.

Yet, there are examples which may be used to try and gain some understanding of what is meant by the Three-In-One of the Trinity.

We might think of the Trinity in terms of a hydro-electric system. First, there is the fast-flowing river gushing along a valley. There long before mankind, never drying up, and bringing life to a land that would be useless without it. Then, through the talents of engineers, builders, designers and labourers, a vast dam is constructed which spans the river to hold back the water. Finally, when it is completed and goes into operation, immense electric power is let loose for the benefit of the people living in that region. Heat, light and power for industry and transport.

All this is from the creative force harnessed by mankind and then set free for great blessings for everyone. The creative Father, is brought to us by the Son, who showed us how to live, and followed by the unstoppable power of the Holy Spirit let loose into the world.

Or, to use the example of water in a different way, we might think of a spring that comes out of the ground up in the mountains. It flows down through the valleys to become a river and then flows into the sea at its estuary. If we think of the spring as the beginning, and the river as the descendant of that spring, with the Spirit covering the world like the seas. All of these aspects of the river and sea are the same water, but different facets and with different functions.

We think of God the Father as our Creator, we think of God the Son as the one who redeemed us, who gave His life to save us. Then, we think of God the Holy Spirit as the present-day source of the power of love in the world.

Yes, the Holy Trinity is a mystery – One God in Three Persons, a God who is within us and yet beyond us. But above all it is a mystery of Love. We celebrate it today. It is not something we can ever hope to understand fully. It is something to believe and to live with love

Second Reading Letter from St. Paul to the Romans 8: 14-17 We are children of God: created by our Abba, heirs with Christ, and led by the Spirit. We have been chosen because of great love.

Gospel Reading Matthew 28: 16-20

From a great mountaintop, Jesus commissions the disciples to go forth and baptize in the name of God as Trinity.

The Three Readings In Summary:

Great things happen on mountaintops, and all three readings revolve around the greatness of God and God's love. Moses calls the Israelites to consider the great things done by God, and Paul challenges the Romans to consider the greatness of our Christian heritage. Finally, the conclusion of Matthew's Gospel has Jesus on top of a mountain, sending forth the eleven chosen ones to do great things-to baptize and to teach, and to know that he will be with them until the end of the world.
