Religious Education Senior Cycle

Teaching religion was not a road, which was planned, but having journeyed so far, I will most definitely continue.

When describing the mind of an ordinary senior cycle student I arrive at the two words, 'Spirituality' and 'Faith', however, in two extremes. Many people tend to condemn the youth and their attitude toward Church and God. From my experience working with students, it is quite apparent that they have a very deep spirituality, but not a healthy faith.

Being faithful to church doesn't seem an important option to the average teenager. This is not always their fault. Faith needs to be disciplined and nurtured, by parents especially, and by teachers and church. When it comes to faith I feel obliged to educate the students I work with. They have a huge appetite but are not always fed. It would be an act of 'betrayal' on anyone's behalf not to nurture faith, and it is always an act of love to encourage it.

We are presently preparing for our Leaving Cert 'Mass' celebration. Mass marks the first, and the final event of their school days in Coláiste Choilm - First year and Leaving Cert Mass.

Giving a 'good liturgical experience' is something, which can only encourage these students. Teaching religion has not become easier, it is not just a subject for school, but also for when they have left us. If they do not receive it, they will encounter more struggles when it comes to living. Religion is a huge subject as it embraces and challenges all areas of life. The current RE programme for Senior Cycle students is 'The Challenge of God' by Niall Boyle, and we also use the 'Waze Magazine', 'Life Waze', 'Prayers Waze' and 'Just Waze' and the monthly Redemptionist magazine 'Face Up'.

Issues arising through newspaper articles, TV, etc. are always addressed. It is the role of all teachers, but especially RE teachers, to help students as they examine their attitudes towards important matters and to assist them in their development of a more mature appreciation of their Christian faith.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

FIRST READING: Acts 4: 8-12

Peter, who had once trembled before a servant maid is now fearless before the High Priest through the grace of the Holy Spirit as Jesus had promised. Instead of defending himself he preaches the new Faith. Salvation comes through the person of Christ, not through the rigorous observation of the Law, as the Jews believed.

SECOND READING: 1 John 3: 1-2

Because God has adopted the faithful into his family the world hates them. But the adoption entitles them to a future state of glory, like that of God himself. The true nature of this glorification is not yet clear; but after this life faith will give way to the vision of God.

GOSPEL: John 10: 11-18

The image of the shepherd and the sheep is taken from many passages in the Old Testament. The single sentence "I am the good shepherd" would have called up much of sacred scripture for those listening to Jesus. In this lovely poetic passage, Jesus speaks of the affection that unites him with his followers. He looks beyond the Jewish nation to the whole gentile world where "the other sheep" await the call of the good shepherd. So much does the Good Shepherd love his sheep that he is prepared to lay down his life for them.
