Easter Sunday 2009

The gospel this morning is an account of a journey that many families make on a regular basis; going to the grave of their loved one. This Easter our graveyards will give silent witness to many sad tears shed by parents, wives and husbands, sons and daughters and friends. Memories will be rekindled of hopes and dreams now shattered by death, memories that keep a loved one present to family and friends. We notice every detail of the grave of loved ones, any changes to grass or weeds, flowers left by family and friends.

The gospel this morning speaks of Mary coming to the tomb of her friend Jesus. She rushes to Peter to report that the grave has been interfered with. Life was difficult enough with the death of their friend Jesus and their big hope for the future and a better life for them and their friends. The news that the tomb was ransacked must have been the last straw for them, the dead weren't even allowed to rest.

The drama really developed quickly for them once Peter and the other disciple got to the tomb. The other disciple finally entered the tomb, he saw and he believed. What did he believe, not only was Jesus missing from the tomb but He was risen from the dead, " that he must rise from the dead". Easter then is a new beginning for Peter, Mary and the other disciple. They continued to live in fear but the shoots of a new life were already appearing.

May Easter be a time of new hope for each of us, may it be a time when the Risen Lord will bring some light, joy and the courage to enable us to live our lives knowing that Jesus is with us. May we in the words of today's second reading know that Christ is our life.

Happy Easter to everybody and to your families. Give us the strength to look out for one another and support each other.

Alpha

The Ballincollig Parish *Alpha* course begins after Easter. This is an opportunity to explore the meaning of life in an informal, fun and friendly environment. The course starts on Wednesday April 15th, and continues in Colaiste Colm on each Wednesday evening from 7.30 pm to 9.30 pm for ten weeks. The course explores some of the basic truths of the Christian faith – “Who is Jesus?” “Why Did Jesus Die?” “How does God guide us?” and “What about the Church?” During the programme there is an option of a day away to explore the work of the Holy Spirit. This course is relaxed, non-threatening, low key and friendly. We meet weekly and listen to a talk lasting 40 minutes, followed by a tea/coffee break and small group discussion to discuss the talk and questions arising from it. *Alpha* is for everyone; no question is out of bounds and you are free to discuss as much or as little as you wish.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43
Peter preached about Jesus' baptism, the anointing with the Holy Spirit, works of kindness and healing, and his crucifixion and resurrection from the dead. All who believe in him are forgiven.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4
Think about what is above. When Christ appears, then you shall appear with him in glory.

Gospel: John 20:1-9
On Friday afternoon when Jesus died, the women had not been able to finish the customary preparation for burial. The Sabbath began at sundown on Friday, so Mary of Magdala hurried to the tomb Sunday morning to complete her task. She found the tomb empty. Certain that Jesus' body had been stolen, she ran back to get the other disciples. Peter and the other disciple also found an empty tomb but with Jesus' clothing rolled neatly and placed where his body had been. The disciples still didn't understand about the resurrection and Mary wept. As she cried, two angels appeared asking why she was crying. She then saw a gardener and asked him where the body might be. When he called her by name, Mary immediately recognised Jesus.
