Third Sunday of Advent

The coming of Christ brought joy to the world as He healed every sickness and overcame human deprivation. For those who suffer, the joy of Christ's first coming must be tempered by patience as they await their restoration at his Second Coming.

Third Sunday of Advent - Gaudete Sunday

This weekend the Word of God has several comforting messages for each of us. In the first reading from Isaiah we are urged to " strengthen all weary hands; Courage! Do not be afraid. "St James urges us in the second reading to" Be patient! Do not lose heart," The Gospel Jesus speaks to john the Baptist "Happy the person who does not lose faith in me ". The comforting words in today's readings are addressed to us now. We need to be guided by these words, because like John we can find ourselves in dark situations.

We might be going along nicely but then a storm suddenly hits us, unemployment, a serious illness, a suicide in the family, break up of a relationship. These kind of things shatter our faith in the right order of things and even in God. At times like this may we hear the words of Isaiah "Courage! Do not be afraid",

John the Baptist was a God fearing man, yet he ended up in prison under sentence of death. We can do our best but things may still go wrong. We feel let down by God. We can doubt God's love for us and perhaps even doubt His existence. At times like these may we hear the words of Jesus, "Blessed is the person who does not loose faith in me ".

Alcoholism is a terrible affliction. So too is drug addiction. Addiction to gambling brings untold pain, suffering and hardship. These addictions cause misery to the sufferer and to those who live with them. The addict needs help and the courage to ask for help. May they hear the words of Isaiah "Courage! Do not be afraid".

The scandal of child abuse by clergy and religious has angered and traumatised people of faith and non believers. Many people are shattered that such pain is inflicted on children and their families. May we hear the words of Jesus "Blessed is the person who does not lose faith in me ".

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 35:1-6, 10 Isaiah now describes the joy of the kingdom. Advent is a time of gladness because we know that Christ is coming.

Second Reading: St. James 5:7-10 The prophets of old were teachers; they spoke God's truth. The second reading reminds us to take them as our models.

Gospel: Matthew 11:2-11.

John the Baptist had disciples of his own and while in prison he sent some of them to Jesus. At John's request, the disciples asked Jesus if he was the Messiah or were they to wait for another. Jesus did not answer them directly, but pointed to the miracles he had performed in the name of God's love. If John himself did not wonder, it was likely that his followers did. Jesus did not fit the image of "Messiah," and so it was possible that people began to doubt their original perception.

Free Handyman Service for Older People Are you 65+ years of age and living in Cork City and suburbs, Ballincollig, Kinsale, Carrigaline, Glanmire or Carrigtwohill? Do you have a small repair job that you would like to have done for you? Age Action's Care & Repair service uses a pool of trustworthy volunteer handypersons to carry out minor repairs and odd jobs for older people who find it difficult to do these jobs themselves.

Some of the jobs that our volunteers can do include changing light bulbs, changing locks, minor painting and decorating, hanging curtains, minor gardening, minor carpentry and installing smoke alarms. The service is free; you only pay for the materials used. For your bigger jobs that are beyond the scope of our volunteers, we maintain a register of reliable and honest tradespersons whose contact details we can provide for you. We can also arrange regular social visits to older people. All volunteers are Garda vetted and carry official Age Action identification cards. You can arrange to have a job done for you by phoning the Age Action Care & Repair number, 1890 369 369.
