Third Sunday of Advent

The third Sunday of Advent sees the pink candle lighting in our Advent wreath. This Sunday the Liturgy asks us to Rejoice. "Rejoice in the Lord always, the Lord is near, he has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away; He will exult with joy over you.

Today's gospel passage reminds us of the fountain of joy that should bubble up within the hearts of all believers. That fountain is nourished by two realities. The first is that God loves us. The second is that because of God's love we gladly share what we have. What could be more simple? What could be more difficult? We are a people who crave creature comforts. We blindly live in hope that more 'things' will make us happy. But this is not true and we know it is not true. Neverthe less, our actions proclaim that it is true. A wise person once said, "if we cannot have what we want, we should learn to want what we have".

Anthony de Mello tells this story; a man goes to his Master asks for help. His wife, children and in-laws living in a single room. Everyone is on edge. The room is hell. The Master listens to his plight and then says, "Do you promise to do whatever I tell you? The man desperate fro relief, agrees. The Master then enquires if he has any animals. Upon learning that the man has a cow, a goat and six chickens, the Master tells him to bring all the animals into his room and then come back and see him in a week's time. When the man returns he is frantic. Life is awful. The room is filthy, the stench is unbearable. The Master listens and then says, "Go back and put the animals out." The man returns the next day to proclaim, "How sweet life is! The animals are out. The house is a paradise – so quiet, clean and roomy!"

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Peter Canisius 21-December-2003
St. Peter Canisius lived in one of the most troubled centuries for the Catholic Church: 1521-1597. As a Dutch Law student he decided to join the newly founded Jesuit Order. While many of the early members of the Order went to the foreign Missions in the Far East, he believed that it was as important to defend Catholic truths with the pen as it was to convert the Hindus. A truly modern man, he realised the importance of the newly invented printing press in spreading Catholic teaching and defending it against the Protestant preachers. There was, however, no bitterness in his opposition to the Protestant movement. He requested Catholic authors to advocate the truth with modesty and dignity without scoffing or ridicule.

The Saint's most famous work was a catechism of 211 questions and answers, which was published in 1555. This showed his lifelong concern for the religious education of children.
