ELEVEN HAPPY YEARS

This past week, Bishop Buckley has appointed a new parish priest to Ballincollig. Fr. George O'Mahony takes up duty this weekend. He comes into a parish that has always offered a welcome to its new priests and ongoing generous support in every area of church life ranging from assistance at the celebration of Mass to fund raising to clear parish debts. He will also be welcomed by his three priest colleagues who work together in peace, harmony and unselfish cooperation.

The ever-growing town of Ballincollig is a model of the new style suburban communities typical of present day Ireland. The drift from agriculture and the severity of planning laws has meant that soon most Irish people will live in commuter belts around the cities. Tallaght, Carrigaline, Dublin Hill are typical of such developing communities. It is a new life style, far different from the county town, the inner city and the rural village; less personal, perhaps, but more exciting in the new social challenges offered to parents, educators and religious leaders. Unfortunately such suburban communities in some Irish cities have proved disastrous for the youth with drugs, violence and murder causing untold suffering to unfortunate families.

The Ballincollig community has gone a different and better road. In every family education is a priority. John F. Kennedy once remarked that civilization is a race between education and disaster. Few communities are as blessed with schools of the size and quality of the primary and secondary schools found here. This situation has not come about by accident but rather as a result of the enthusiasm and sacrifice of parents, teachers and, especially, the parish community that has contributed enormously to the cost of building and maintaining parochial schools. The religious ethos found in all our schools reflects that of the home. Newspapers so frequently headline "falling Mass attendance" these days. In Ballincollig there has been no evidence of such a drop. What could be more encouraging for the priests of the parish than to look down at the crowded churches that characterise week-end Masses such as the 6 o'clock and 12 o'clock in St. Mary and St. John's and the 5.30 in Christ our Light!

On leaving Ballincollig after eleven happy years for a new position in Clonakilty, I should like to thank every one who has been so kind over those years, which sped by so rapidly. May God bless you all and especially your new parish priest who will no doubt enjoy as happy a time with you as I have had.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading Deuteronomy 4: 32-34. 39-40 Moses questions the people, 'Has anything as great as this ever happened before?' in order to help them see the awesome greatness of their God.

Second Reading Letter from St. Paul to the Romans 8: 14-17 We are children of God: created by our Abba, heirs with Christ, and led by the Spirit. We have been chosen because of great love.

Gospel Reading Matthew 28: 16-20 From a great mountaintop, Jesus commissions the disciples to go forth and baptize in the name of God as Trinity.

THE THREE READINGS IN SUMMARY:

Great things happen on mountaintops, and all three readings revolve around the greatness of God and God's love. Moses calls the Israelites to consider the great things done by God, and Paul challenges the Romans to consider the greatness of our Christian heritage. Finally, the conclusion of Matthew's Gospel has Jesus on top of a mountain, sending forth the eleven chosen ones to do great things-to baptize and to teach, and to know that he will be with them until the end of the world.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Romuald 19-June-2003

St. Romuald was born at Ravenna about the year 956. In spite of an infinite desire for virtue and sanctity, his early life was wasted in the service of the world and its pleasures. Then one day, obliged by his father, Sergius, to be present at a duel fought by him, he beheld him slay his adversary. The crime made such an impression upon him that he determined to expiate it for forty days, as though it were entirely his own. For this purpose he retired to a Benedictine monastery of St. Apollinare, near Ravenna, where he became Abbot. After founding several monasteries, he laid the foundations of the austere Order of Camaldoli in Tuscany. Like all the saints, he fought a lifelong battle against the assaults of devils and men. In the beginning of his spiritual life he was strongly assailed by numerous temptations, which he conquered by vigilance and prayer. More than one attempt was made on his life, but Divine Providence enabled him to escape from the danger. Like many servants of God, he also became the victim of calumny, which he bore in patience and silence. In his old age, he increased his austerities instead of diminishing them. After a long life of merit, he died in the monastery of Castro, which he founded in Marquisate of Ancona. His death occurred on June 19, about the year 1027.
