Death And Eternal Life

People often ask how can we know that there is an after life since no one ever came back to tell us. Abraham said to the rich man in the parable about poor Lazarus "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead." We have to believe in God, we have to meet him in prayer, in reflection, in Word and in Sacrament, and we have to serve him in others if we are to accept the truth of an after life. Argument, discussion, proofs cannot convince us. We must have an openness to goodness, to truth, to God.

The patient was frail and weak, her voice barely audible, yet her smile, the sparkle in her eye, showed her spirit. Even at death's door she was very much alive. She was even grateful that she had lived already six months longer than she was given in the initial prognosis. She had lived those days as she had lived her life, with faith, with hope and full of love and concern for her family, her friends, for those who now cared for her. "It can't be much longer now," she said, with courage as well as resignation. She could see beyond death to resurrection, she could see in the words of scripture "for to Him all people are in fact alive." The young heroin addict in a recent TV programme was asked, "... how long can you go on like that, what next?" He was matter of fact in his reply - "A year or two and then death." The answer was as hopeless as the story of his life. The tragedy is not so much that he will die young but that he has already ceased to live. If life has no meaning what can eternal life mean? A postscript told us that he had not lived to the screening of the TV programme.

This month, November, we are particularly conscious not just of death but of life beyond death. We remember with love those who have died. We reach out in love to them by our prayers and offerings. This is not just a prayer of faith, it is an act of faith, it is a practice of faith. The very practice nourishes faith it opens us to God. It can also help to make us conscious that the gift of life that we have overflows into eternal life. It can give us peace and confidence in the face of the certainty of death. There is life in the next world. It lasts for all eternity with God. Don't you want to enter it?

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Daniel 12: 1-13

At the end of time, the angels of God will appear. The dead will rise. The saints will shine like the stars. This is the glory of the Second Coming of Christ.

Second Reading: Hebrews 10: 11-14. 18 Jesus reigns in glory, at the right hand of God. His one, perfect sacrifice has won for us the kingdom of heaven.

Gospel: Mark 13:24-32.

Mark's community lived in a time of persecution, uneasiness and discouragement. They needed hope and Mark supplied it in his presentation of Jesus just before the story of his passion, death and resurrection. Some people call this portion of Mark's Gospel "Little Apocalypse" because it refers to events in the end times. Certain occurrences will be visible before Jesus returns and Mark has Jesus say words that help his community look for signs. The words in this Gospel indicate that "this" generation will not pass away before "these things have taken place." What is not exactly clear is what things, but the most important point is that the people of Mark's community find hope in Jesus' return.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Columban 23-November-2003

St. Columban, also widely known as Columbanus, was born around 543 and became a monk of Bangor on the coast of County Down. He later set out with twelve companions for Burgundy in France where he established a monastery in Annegray. Owing to the incursions of the barbarians and the laxity of the clergy, the Church in France was at that time in a weak state. Wherever Columban and his Irish monks went the people were struck by their modesty, patience and humility. So many joined them in their hard monastic life that two further monastic foundations followed at Luxeuil and Fontaine.

Because the life of Columban was a rebuke to the royal life style he and his Irish monks were ordered out of French territory. After many difficulties they journeyed to Italy where they founded the monastery at Bobbio between Milan and Genoa. There the saint died. In 1482 his body was placed in a new shrine and laid beneath the altar in the crypt where it is still venerated.

After Columbanus many Irish monks went to work on continental Europe where they are credited with keeping both Christianity and learning alive during the Dark Ages following the collapse of Roman power.
