Seek First the Kingdom of God

In the first reading we see King Cyrus being empowered by God to be his instrument in his divine plan to liberate the Jews, his chosen people. This shows that God can work through people who may not even recognize his name. God addresses Cyrus as his anointed one. Having received the sacrament of Baptism, we too are his anointed ones and he continues to call each one of us of by name. Just as God watched over the people of Babylon, he continues to watch over us today. He never ceases to care for his Church and reminds us that there is no other God besides him and apart from him all is nothing.

In the second reading from St Paul, we hear more about the greatness of God. His letter to the Thessalonians was addressed to the Church as a whole. Paul gives thanks to God in prayer for all the blessings that the Thessalonians have received. He commends them for the way they have shown faith in action, for their labour of love and how they have persevered through hope in Jesus Christ. We, like them, know that God is our loving Father and we too have received the gift of the Holy Spirit and are called to live a life of faith, a life of hope and a life of love. We pray for the courage and guidance to become true apostles of Jesus Christ.

In the gospel the Pharisees try to trap Jesus by asking him if it is permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not. Jesus asks them whose image is on the coin that they pay the tax with. Having responded it was Caesar's, he said to them 'give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and give back to God what was belongs to God'. Just like the money was made with the image of Caesar on it, we are made in the image and likeness of God. We belong to God. Everything good that we have comes from the hand of the Lord. Our life, our ability to think and love and relate to others, our individual talents-all of these are gifts from our heavenly Father. If God has given us all that we are and have, then he deserves the very best we have to give him in return: our love, our loyalty, our faithful service. First Reading: Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

In this passage from the prophet Isaiah, God is revealed as the one who calls us by name and gives us the strength we need.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5

Paul reminds his community at Thessalonica that the good news of Jesus is a source of power.

Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21

The chief priests and Pharisees tried to trap Jesus into making a political error or renouncing God's authority. They asked whether or not it was lawful to pay taxes to the emperor. Pointing out that it was Caesar's head on the coin, Jesus told them to give to the emperor what was due the emperor, but to pay more attention to what belonged to God.


