Water Into Wine

Christmas is over and we begin the new year with resolutions, with hope. Sad experience tells us that not all the resolutions will be kept, and in spite of the hope there is a sense of foreboding. Things were bad enough last year, are they likely to be any better this year. Will Jesus who changed water into wine make something better of our wounded Church? As we pray for renewal in the Church, for forgiveness and healing, we pray for renewal in our own lives too.

The account of the wedding at Cana is by any stretch of the imagination an unusual wedding story; we are not told who is getting married, Mary was "there" but Jesus was "invited." Running out of wine meant disappointment, an absence of the joy proper to a wedding celebration. It also meant deep shame, in the honour/shame society of that time to run out of supplies at a wedding was a family calamity. Jesus is asked to restore life and joy, and he does by taking ordinary water, washing water, and changes it into extraordinary wine.

A theme of wedding joy runs through the readings from Isaiah and the Gospel of John for this second Sunday in ordinary time. Isaiah speaks of God's people no longer forsaken, but with restored integrity. God delights in his people, rejoices over them as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride. The Church is the bride of Christ, at a time of darkness and shame we may ask where is the wedding joy, can we get it back; can the Lord restore us, tell us that we are no longer forsaken and that our integrity will be restored, so that he may indeed rejoice over us. And each of us may dare to hope that the Lord will take the muddy waters of our lives and change them into wine.

In John's gospel Mary appears at Cana and at Calvary, at the foot of the cross. At Cana she speaks, intercedes for those in need. Jesus tells his mother that his hour has not yet come, yet she persists in her request, quietly confident. She tells the servants to do whatever he tells them, she had no idea what he was going to do, but had total confidence in him. At Calvary Mary is silent, when Jesus' hour has indeed come and the sword of sorrow breaks her own heart. We pray for reliance on the intercession of Mary, given to us as our mother by Jesus as he hung dying on the Cross.

Reflection for Parents

The point Jesus wanted to illustrate by performing this sign was to introduce a change. Many scholars interpret the wedding as the new age and the huge stone jars represent the magnitude of the wonder. There is great abundance in the story and that is the message of the new order Jesus promises - God lavishes us with his abundant love and we come to know that love through Jesus. In today's Gospel, John relates the story of the beginning of Jesus' ministry at Cana. We celebrate the bountiful love of God for humankind symbolised in the six jars of wine and we ask for the grace to respond positively to the words of Mary: 'Do whatever he tells you.'

First Reading: Is 62:1-5

Second Reading: Cor 12:4-11

People have many different gifts. Nevertheless, the Church is united, because all these gifts come from the one God.

Gospel: John 2:1-11.

While the Wedding in Cana is a familiar story, it only appears in John's Gospel. Scholars call it the first of Jesus' signs. Mary, Jesus' mother, observed that the wine was running low at a wedding feast she and Jesus were attending. She didn't specifically ask Jesus to do something about the situation, but he understood the implication. He instructed the servants to fill six stone jars with water and then take some to the waiter in charge. The waiter was surprised that the bridegroom had saved the best wine for last. The servants were surprised because they knew the jars were filled with water and they had witnessed something remarkable.
