That Your Joy May Be Complete

One of the great joys in life is knowing that we are in fact loved, loved and accepted for ourselves. God loved the world, loved us, so much that he gave his only son that we might be saved, have life. God's love fills the earth, extend as the psalmist says to the ends of the earth. We are naturally drawn to a vision of peace and joy, and we note that the commandment to love one another does not look too hard. God wants us to be joyful. Rejoice always, this is the will of God for you (c. f. 1 Thess 5:16, 18). Jesus asks us to remain in his love, so that our joy may be complete. We try to respond.

But what do we do. When we know we are loved, as well as feeling good, we grow, become more alive. God loved us first. We respond to God's love by reflecting that love, by becoming generous, loving people, loving with a love that is kind, gentle, patient, makes allowances and is other-centred. If we are to remain in his love, there must be communication. We can talk to him in prayer, but what about his side of the conversation? How do we listen to him? The best way of hearing the words of God for us is to read his word, to be like the man in Psalm 1 who takes delight in the law of the Lord, in Scripture, in the Bible. This is not a matter of Bible Study as such, it is a matter of coming to know God more and more rather than merely knowing about him. Reading the Bible for a few minutes every day can result in a transforming relationship with God through Jesus, as we speak to and hear from the person we read about in the Gospels. And as we listen to him in our heart, our characters become more like his.

Jesus reminded us in last week's gospel that cut off from the vine we wither, without him we can do nothing. If we read the Bible prayerfully then we can more easily remain in his love, and be guided and strengthened to withstand the storms of life.

Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock. The rain fell, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. (Mat 7:24-25)

That is how we can remain in Jesus, how our lives can be filled with his love and our joy be complete.

In the Grief process, Shock and Disbelief are a normal initial reaction. It is hard to take in the news that someone you love has died; you feel stunned and numb. This numbness is nature's way of protecting one from the full impact of the death and the intensity of acute emotional pain, helping you to get through the early days and weeks. During this initial time you are surrounded by relatives/friends. It can often be months (or longer) when reality sets in and the full impact of your loss is felt, that you may feel isolated and alone, especially if you no longer have the initial caring support. It is helpful to talk through your feelings with someone at this time. Facing grief is painful, yet it is the beginning of a journey that eventually bring healing. THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48.

Saint Peter lays down the principle that God chooses his elect no matter what their nationality. All are acceptable if they are in the right disposition. While Peter was speaking the Holy Spirit descended on the Gentiles. It is the only case of the reception of the Holy Spirit before baptism.

Second Reading: 1 John 4: 7-10

The love of God and of the neighbour are so closely related that one cannot exist without the other. When God decided to restore mankind to his original supernatural state his love knew no bounds. He sent his only son into the world to lay down his life for our sins. This was an act of purest love.

Gospel: John 15: 9-17.

The observance of the commandments is the real proof of that union of wills that is called love. Jesus reduces his commandments to one:" that you love one another, as I have loved you." The standard is Jesus' own love.


