My Vision

Having been a Religious Education Teacher over the past ten years I must admit that this has been a challenging experience but extremely worthwhile nonetheless. I, myself, have grown over the past decade with a greater understanding of who I am and what my purpose is, with my own conviction being my best resource.

In nurturing the faith of each individual student it is my firm belief that all Religious Education teachers should deepen their understanding of Human Existence in a Christian context. The task on hand is to give each individual student a good grounding in the fundamentals of Christianity while accompanying them on their journey of faith. This is intrinsic in their faith experience.

During their stay here in Coláiste Choilm students will learn about making good moral choices and will be enabled to grow in moral maturity. They will begin to understand that morality is about accepting self and others as part of God's plan for us. They will realise the importance of informing their conscience and that in making moral decisions there are consequences to their actions.

From first year to leaving cert we have the responsibility to arm each student for life. Each year being another step forward in their understanding of what it means to be a Christian – which is no easy task.

I feel that crucial to their understanding of faith we, as religion teachers, must ensure that their faith experiences are a very positive one as indeed we are a product of all our life experiences.

Many teachers in schools today have taken on pastoral responsibilities in the classroom and in school generally this applies particularly to teachers of religious studies.

It behoves all of us as teachers not only to be professional in what we do in class but also to incorporate pastoral issues and their care as part of our remit. School should be a place where each student is valued equally and given a genuine sense of belonging in the hope that as adult Christians it will be replicated in their lives.

As teachers of religious education we have to nurture this Christian vision of hope and I wish to continue to do so for many years to come – God willing!

THE SUNDAY READINGS

FIRST READING: Acts 9: 26-31

When St. Stephen was stoned to death because of his preaching Paul (then known as Saul) was in charge of the execution. Now, however, after his conversion on the road to Damascus, he returns to Jerusalem and takes up where Stephen left off: preaching the same message. Again this preaching arouses the same fury and the Disciples, fearing for his life, sent him away to his home town of Tarsus.

SECOND READING: 1 John 3: 18-24

Love of God and of the neighbour are inseparable. In practising either we must not rest satisfied with expressions of devotion and good will. Only when charity is active does conscience assure us that we are leading sincere Christian lives. Two things sum up what is most pleasing to God; faith in the divine personality of Jesus Christ and brotherly love according to Christ's instructions.

GOSPEL: John 15: 1-8

In this allegory the cultivation of the vine is attributed to God the Father. A fruitless branch is lopped off like Judas. The pruning clean of the Apostles is the result of the words Jesus spoke to them. A separated vine branch is useless. It is destined for the fire. Fruitfulness and discipleship go together.
