The gospel this week is from St Matthew. It is an account of the Annunciation to Joseph. He was living with his young bride Mary the love of his life. I am sure Joseph had many hopes and dreams for their life together but his hopes and dreams were shattered almost before married life began. Mary was pregnant, what was he to do and the consequences for Mary were intimidating.

Many people are living with fear, anxiety and anger during these days. To survive on a pension or a low income is always a struggle; however making ends meet when a low wage is cut by five or ten percent is a harrowing experience facing many people this Christmas. More and more people in our midst are asking the question posed by Joseph, "what am I to do, how will I survive". I just wish I had an answer to the question as tears trickle down the faces of worried and frightened people. Ballincollig today has many people suffering; no one deserves to suffer and certainly those on pensions and low wages should not be expected to carry further burdens. Many others have lost their jobs, their homes and even their health. Parents and families are living in fear and trepidation

Joseph is described in today's Gospel as being a man of honour, I think many of us would hope that we are people of honour. Perhaps we might wake from our dreams and our slumbers and insist that enough is enough. The low paid and poor are being asked to carry too many burdens and too much pain. This has to stop.

I take this opportunity on behalf of Fr Michael, Fr Billy, Fr James and myself to wish you and your families a very happy and peaceful Christmas. Thank you for your support and generosity during the year. A special word of thanks to the many people on giving of their time and talents to the George O'Mahony various ministries in the parish..

We pray for those who have died; that they may be raised to eternal life in the kingdom of heaven. Lord, Hear us.



The Origin of 'Silent Night'

A holy night, a silent night, with Mother and child, all is calm, all is bright. This inspiring hymn came to us because an organ in Germany broke down about one hundred years ago.

Without an organ the parish priest in a small country church said it would be a 'Silent Night'. The organist would compose a melody. The priest would write the lyrics and the choir would just sing the soft praises of this hymn for Midnight Mass. That is all it was meant to be, just a simple hymn sung once and forgotten.

Then a snowstorm prevented the man who fixed the organ from coming until the snow melted in the spring. After he finished he noticed the music left on the organ since Christmas night and took it back to Munich. The rest is history.

"Silent Night" has reverberated throughout the ages. With its quiet sounds of love and peace it has inspired millions and millions, touching the lives of countless people.

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

The first reading contains Isaiah's prophecy of the events we celebrate at Christmas.

Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7

Paul's message is another reminder of what we

are preparing to celebrate.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24

Matthew recounts the circumstances of Jesus' birth by telling us the story of Mary's engagement to Joseph and the child she carried originating from the Holy Spirit. This reality made no sense to Joseph, but he did not want to dishonour Mary so he planned to quietly divorce her. An angel came and told Joseph not to be afraid, that Mary's child was conceived by the Holy Spirit and that they should call him Emmanuel meaning, "God is with us."
