"Who do people say I am"

Jesus began life as the carpenters' son, sometimes referred to as the son of Mary. Later in Chapter 4 of St Luke's gospel Christ announces " The spirit of the Lord is given to me, for he has anointed me, he has sent me to bring good news to the poor."

Jesus engaged the disciples in conversation. "Who do people say I am" or How do I appear to others?. These are questions that people ask but especially those in the public eye. Jesus asked the question and availed of the opportunity to make a public revelation of himself. When Jesus asked His question he did so for the benefit of his friends the Apostles. Jesus was well able to cope with adulation and hostility.

The Gospels give us an account of Christ and His gradual understanding of His role as Messiah. Messiah for many was about power, influence and adulation. Some thought he might be John the Baptist, other Elijah or some other prophet. Peter had a very good ensight," you are the Christ of God".

He then presents to them the prospect of rejection and shameful death. Moreover true discipleship is about self emptying. The path of the Christian is not to power and privilege but to simplicity and humility. There can be suffering in this path but the reward is freedom in Christ.

First Reading: Zech. 12:10-11; 13:1

The Prophet Zechariah announces that the Messiah will suffer, and that people 'will look upon the pierced One'.

Second Reading: Gal. 3:26-29

St Paul speaks of the unity which faith brings.

Gospel: Luke 9:18-24

Jesus asked his disciples who the people said he was. He learned that some said he was John the Baptist while others thought he might be Elijah. He asked the disciples themselves who they thought he was. Peter, speaking for all them, said he was the messiah, the one that Israel had been waiting for. Jesus immediately told them to say nothing of this to anyone because he had much yet to suffer. In order to help his followers understand the commitment of discipleship, he explained that they must take up their own crosses--that is, make sacrifices--in order to follow him

Cancer Risks, Did you know?

- Ireland has among the highest skin cancer rates in Europe.
- Two-thirds of Irish people have a higher risk of developing Skin Cancer because of their skin type.
- 90% of all skin cancers are preventable
- Damage to the skin by the sun is permanent. In later life this can lead to skin cancer.
- For the majority of the population, 10-15 minutes daily exposure of the face and hands to the sun and adequate diet provides a sufficient level of vitamin D.
- Skin damage is caused by exposure to ultraviolet rays, which are strongest from 11 am to 3 pm.
- The number of skin cancer cases is rising every year.
