Both Jonah and Jesus brought urgent messages for the need for repentance and change in peoples lives. Such change was needed to make them open to the action of God. If there is to be unity among the followers of Christ, we all need to change.

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Christ of today's gospel makes it very clear that there is a time for words and also a time for something more - actions-. The four individuals (Simon, Andrew, James and John) mentioned in today's gospel had some contact with John the Baptist and probably stood at the edge of the crowd listening to Jesus. Then they met Christ as they were doing their work casting their nets, he invited them, "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men," For here on they had a vocation, they left their jobs behind them. Vocation is about dedication and serving others and finding fulfilment. Many people's vocation is lived out as a parent, teacher, nurse, doctor or religious. Each of us said yes to Lord at our Confirmation and Baptism, may we with the help of God live out our vocation each day of our lives?.

Living the Christian calling involves doing the Lord's work, it also depends on prayer and reflection on the Word of God to nourish and guide us. Christ through his teaching provided this support for his disciples and He also ensured that they joined Him in times of praver and reflection.

This week is dedicated to our catholic schools. We owe a huge debt to our schools and teachers; through their skills and dedication they provide a great education for children in their care. We may talk a great deal about the importance of teachers, parents and the parish working together to help children grow in faith and discover and learn more about their faith. The reality of course is that the majority of the work is left to teachers and schools, some parents take their role as the first educators of their child in the ways of Faith seriously and the parish is often a poor third in the partnership. May this week remind us of our calling and responsibilities in helping children grow in faith.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Jonah 3: 1-5, 10

Most probably the story of Jonah is a type of parable or story to teach a lesson rather than an exact historical book. Looked at that way it would compare with the parables like the Prodigal Son and the Good Samaritan told by Jesus. The central doctrine of the Book of Jonah is the universality of God's love and providence extending beyond the bounds of the Chosen People to pagan nations. Jonah brought an urgent call to repentance to a pagan city. Surprisingly the citizens listened to his message and repented.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians, 7: 29-31

These reflections of St. Paul are not a plea for neglecting earthly concerns, but for concentration on God's service and for treating other things as of secondary interest. Paul sees the need for detachment from this world because of the growing hostility of the pagan world to the Christians, the possibility of an early Second Coming and the shortness and precariousness of human life.

Gospel: Mark 1: 14-20

Like Jonah in the Old Testament, Jesus comes with a similar call to repentance. He proclaimed the good news that the age of Redemption which the Prophets had foretold was at hand. He called on everyone to do penance in order to enter into the new Kingdom.


