IRELAND'S DRINKING PROBLEM

James Joyce once referred to Ireland as "that Island of dreadful thirst". Recently both the President and Taoiseach have spoken in alarming terms of the seriousness of the problem. Several temperance groups from the Pioneers to A.A. devote time and enthusiasm to either solving the problem at individual level or else avoiding it by total abstinence.

"Al-Anon" is one of the lesser-known support groups dedicated to those who suffer indirectly from alcoholism. The Al-Anon Family Groups are a fellowship of relatives and friends of alcoholics who share their experience, strength and hope in order to solve their common problems.

Al-Anon has only one purpose: to help families of alcoholics. Some families have lived with the problem for years; to others the existence of the disease has come as a sudden shock. An example of the latter is the case of the two newly weds who begin their married life together only to find that one suffers from alcoholism. What to do? Where to turn to? These are the questions that the sufferer's partner asks in panic.

Firstly we would like to thank everyone for their generosity last weekend for our Church Gate Collection. Your response was fantastic and will allow us to keep trying to improve our community. We are now half way through the Cork County Council Inter Town Litter Challenge and Ballincollig has moved up to 4th Place.

We have no comments as of yet for last week because the examiners judged Area 3 again in error. So they had to come back out and judge the correct area. Thankfully this happened because our marks improved by 22 in the second judging and the original comments were very poor in relation to Innishmore and advised that this area receive serious attention. Certain business premises also came in for criticism. Full details next week.

Please note that the following areas are to be judged commencing Thursday 22nd May. The Town Centre is judged every week and includes the following Areas; Main Street from the Westpark Hotel to the Western Roundabout near The White Horse Inn. Time Square, The Car Park, The Commercial Area Around Aldi's & Hollywood, The Car Parks Beside The Reel Cinema, Chapel Lane, Station Road, Church of St. Mary & St. John, Scoil Eoin, The Scout Hall, The Cemetery.

The other area to be judged this week is Area 7: Beech Park, The Cloisters, Castle Park, Aishling Close, Cranford Pines, Greystones, Rosewood, Inniscarra and the main road from Spar to Leo Murphy Road. The next area to be judged from Thursday 29th May is Area 8: This includes Carriganarra, Castleknock, Glincool and Maglin Estates. It also includes the Killumney Road from Muskerry Estate to Leo Murphy Road Junction and the Maglin Road from Killumney Road to the river.

We ask everyone in these areas to play their part for the Community and spend a few minutes cleaning up around their own area.
