The two disciples returned to Jerusalem to find their former companions and relate their story to them. This group of individuals were dispirited; they were full of doubts, fear, guilt and grief. They were broken-hearted as a group, their unity was broken two of their number were absent, Judas was dead and Thomas was also absent. Like people in pain they erected a barrier around themselves. The two spoke of meeting the stranger on the road to Emmaus and recognising Him at the breaking of bread.

Jesus didn't wait for them to come to Him. He came to them while they were still fearful and guilt ridden. He broke through the barrier and brought them something they desperately needed. He said to them "Peace be with you," Suddenly the greatness of the occasion dawned on them, death had been overcome, their failings and betrayal had been overcome. God had triumphed, life had triumphed. Jesus had triumphed over all the evil forces stacked against Him. They could start again, they were filled with joy.

The approach of the risen Jesus is so gentle. The humble Jesus gave courage to his crushed friends, healed their wounds, renewed their hope and gave them life. From collapse and failure something new sprung up. The result is they believed in Him and also in themselves.

The Risen Lord and Easter doesn't take away our pain or remove our fears. The Risen Lord gives hope and courage to us in our fears and pain. When we fail we can get encouragement from the disciples of Jesus, with His support they made a fresh start.

May we have some of the peace of Christ and know that Life is stronger than death.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19

In this speech to the Jews, St. Peter aims primarily that Our Lord is the Messiah whose sufferings were foretold by the Prophet Messiah. He wishes to prove that Jesus, in spite of his crucifixion was the Messiah. Peter consoles the Jews with the thought that they had no idea as to whom they were putting to death. Now, however, they are being told so the time has come for them to ask forgiveness for their sins.

Second Reading: 1 John 2: 1-5

The Apostle urges his readers to be very careful to avoid sin; yet he knows the weakness of human nature and holds out the hope of pardon to the sinner because we have an advocate with the Father, one who intercedes for us and for the whole world. Christ exercises this office of advocate for sinners by continually offering the merits of his passion and death on their behalf.

Gospel: Luke 24: 35-48

When Luke set out to write his Gospel he said that he would put all things 'in order'. With these last words of Jesus he welds together what was foretold in Scripture with the mission of the Apostles in the future. Christ had to suffer for the sins of men but as the Messiah he had to rise again and give to the Apostles the power to forgive sins and bring liberation to mankind.

Ballincollig Scouts

The Scout section has been training over the past number of weeks for the third part of our County competition. The first two parts were, the Indoor Skills Challenge, an indoor assessment of 3 skills, knots and lashings, navigation theory and log booking, carried out in patrols. The second part was the Cork City Urban Challenge, a patrol activity involving sketch mapping, estimation and local history. Last weekend the scouts (accompanied by junior teams, out for experience) were on the Knockmealdown's. They arrived in base camp at Mount Melleray scout centre, pitched their tents and were given the route, from this they had to work out the bearings, times and grid points and put all this info on a route card. At 9am Saturday the scouts were dropped at the Vee which is at the foot of the Sugerloaf, from here they had to climb and navigate up the Sugerloaf, Knockmealdown, Knocknagnauv and on to the slopes of Knocknafallia where they had to bear off to Mount Melleray. The day was very good and from the peeks you could see in the distance Youghal and Dungarvan harbours. In all they climbed a combined height of 2867m. After coming off the mountains they had to cook dinner for themselves on a Tranga, which is a meths. Stove. You would think after all the walking they would sleep like lambs, not likely the leaders had to tell them more then once to be quite and go to sleep. They sleep well on the bus back to Ballincollig the following day. Some Scouters are poor listeners because it interferes with what they want to say.


