#### Advent

This weekend marks the beginning of the Church's year and the beginning of the season of Advent as we prepare to welcome the Christ Child at Christmas. We look forward to the celebration of God made man, of Word made flesh, of Emmanuel, God-with-us. In this parish we begin with a three day Advent Retreat in which we are invited to share our troubles with the Lord Jesus, who shares with us his goodness and his healing love. We pray that the retreat will be a source of grace for all in the parish and indeed in the wider community. Other parish events in preparation for Christmas will include centrally our Advent Sunday Liturgies, as well as our weekday Masses, Carol Concerts, Penitential Services and special school events.

The first week of Advent also sees the start of a Ballincollig Parish Alpha course. This is an opportunity to explore the meaning of life in an informal, fun and friendly environment. It starts on Thursday December 2nd, and continues in Colaiste Choilm on Thursday evenings from 7.30 pm to 9.30 pm for ten weeks. The Alpha course explores some of the basic truths of the Christian faith – "Who is Jesus?" "Why Did Jesus Die?" "How does God guide us" and "What about the Church?" A background knowledge of or belief in Christianity is not assumed and everyone is welcome; no question is out of bounds and we are free to discuss as much or as little as we wish. (I remember attending my first Alpha course in 1995, I went along with some reluctance, but found to my surprise that it was friendly and enjoyable, fun really. It explored the faith in a "non-Churchy" and thoroughly adult way.)

Jesus tells us in today's gospel to be alert, to be ready for his coming at a time we do not expect. St Paul tells us that the Day of the Lord is near at hand, we live as it were in the dawn of that day. We are children of the day, of the light and not of darkness, and are called to live accordingly. This is an opportune time for new beginnings as we prepare for Christmas and renew our commitment to a life of Christian service to others, a time to put off the works of selfishness and enter into the joy of the Lord.

#### THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

The Prophet Isaiah speaks of a time when all the nations will hear the Word of God and be united.

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14

St. Paul issues a wake-up call for this Advent season.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-40, 44.

The emphasis of today's Gospel is on the second coming of Jesus. Matthew refers to three events that show we do not know when Jesus will return, but the message is clear: we are to be ready! The first reference Matthew makes is to Noah and the flood. People were occupied with their daily lives / eating, drinking, and marrying. In the second example, men were working in the field and women were grinding at the mill. Some were taken and some remained. In the final example, the master of the house could have prevented the robbery if only he had known when the thief would come. This Gospel is a stern caution for each of us to live in preparation for Jesus' return.

#### **Tension Awareness**

#### Take one thing at a time...

Take the most urgent tasks and pitch into them, one at a time, forgetting the rest for the time being. If you feel you cannot tackle things in this way reflect – Are you sure you are not overestimating the importance of many of the things you have to do?



### Alpha

A new Ballincollig Parish Alpha course begins in December. This is an opportunity to explore the meaning of life in an informal, fun and friendly environment. The course starts on Thursday December 2<sup>nd</sup>, and continues in Colaiste Colm on each Thursday evening from 7.30 pm to 9.30 pm for ten weeks, excluding December 23<sup>rd</sup>. The course explores some of Alpha 1.30 pm to 9.30 pm for the weeks, excluding 2 the basic truths of the Christian faith – "Who is Jesus?" "Why Did Jesus Die?" "How does God guide us" and "What about the Church?" During the programme there is an option of a day away to explore the work of the Holy Spirit. This course is relaxed, non-threatening, low key and friendly. We meet weekly and listen to a talk lasting 40 minutes, followed by a tea/coffee break and small group discussion to discuss the talk and questions arising from it.
