Fourth Sunday of the Year - Prophet

In our culture a prophet is seen as someone who predicts the future; tell us what is around the corner. However in Hebrew scripture times a prophet's chief task was to speak the word of God for today. Many of the prophets took on their role with reluctance; Jeremiah pleaded that he was young 'I do not know how to speak, I am a child.'

But Jahweh replied, 'Do not say, I am a child. Go now to those whom I send you and say whatever I command you.' Jeremiah 1:6.

In many cases also it meant taking an unpopular stance: in times of crisis, however, it frequently involved giving the people words of consolation.

The book of Deuteronomy reminds us of God's promise, 'I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him.' The gospel today reveals Christ casting out the unclean spirit and freeing the man from convulsions; today Lord help us to deal with the demons of our society whether they are - disregard for others, their opinions and dignity.

Lord, we remember times and places when we were held in bondage by an inner force, our inability to forgive another or our inability to accept that I am forgiven: when I am afraid of failure, when greed or ambition leads me to cloud the truth. Then someone began to speak, challenging us to face the truth, a child, a friend or a passage from scripture. It is easy to get angry then, deny it vehemently or complain to another. Like the man in the gospel we cried aloud, threw a tantrum because the Holy one of God is close to us; He has come to take away our sin.

The evil spirit recognized who Jesus was and called him "the Holy One of God." The people didn't understand this meaning. Only the evil spirit recognised Jesus. The people, however, were impressed by Jesus' deeds and brought others to him for healing.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Brigid 01-February-2005

St. Brigid was born at Faughart near Dundalk around 450A.D. Refusing many good offers of marriage, she became a nun and settled with seven other nuns at Croghan Hill. Soon they moved to Kildare where she founded her famous convent of Cill Dara. This small oratory became the centre of religion and learning and developed into a cathedral city. Not only was St. Brigid a patroness of students but she also founded a school of art, including metal work and illumination. From this school came a wondrous book of the Gospels much praised by ancient writers. Unfortunately this illuminated text disappeared around the time of the Reformation.

Her friendship with St. Patrick is attested by the following paragraph from the Book of Armagh, the authenticity of which is beyond question: "Between St. Patrick and St. Brigid, the columns of the Irish, there was a great friendship of charity that had but one heart and one mind. Through him and through her Christ performed many miracles".
