### **Openness**

We may be conscious of tensions in Irish life at present. There are differing views on how we should respond to the economic crisis, different attitudes to pay cuts and public finances, and in the meantime real people are suffering in the new economic reality. There are tensions in social life, for example between different lifestyles, in attitudes to our immigrant community, the New Irish. In political life there is often a failure to give opponents a fair hearing or even respect. In the Church we have the fallout from the scandals and the recent Murphy and Ryan reports. And in the midst of all this we are called to witness to the Gospel of Christ, to the Christian calling of love.

God said to Jeremiah, and says to each of us, brace yourself, I will make you strong; I know you, I called you, consecrated you and I am with you. Our Christian calling is not easy, but as we respond, God is with us. The call is to love, the way that is best of all, as St Paul puts it. He says that without it we are nothing, shadow people I suppose, living a shadowy existence. Love is patient, kind and willing to make allowances. Love endures all things and does not come to an end. We are very familiar with this reading from wedding ceremonies, but its context is that love we are to have for the Christian family as a whole, and for all people. Jesus' own people in Nazareth were impressed with his gracious words, but were not going to let him get above himself, "sure this is Joseph's son." Jesus anticipated their final reaction when he remarked that no one is a prophet at home and then provoked that reaction by reminding them that that God's help was given to a widow in Sidon when there were many widows in Israel and to Naaman the Syrian leper when there were many lepers in Israel. His message of openness to all mankind was angrily rejected.

The challenge for us is have an open and loving attitude to all, to those who are different, those of other religions, of other social backgrounds, those of different race, those of whom we don't approve because of lifestyle or even because of economic or political viewpoint. To be open to others may require a certain strength of character, at times it won't be easy. And so we brace ourselves, knowing that the God of love will be with us.

First Reading: Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19

Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before your birth I blessed you. I appointed you a prophet to all nations. The will fight you but not prevail, for I am with you.

Jesus went to Nazareth and taught in the temple. At first the people were amazed at his knowledge but then it occurred to them, he was one of them--a carpenter in their own village! They became very angry with Jesus and planned to throw him bodily from a nearby mountain top. Jesus simply walked through them and left. Some scholars say that the crowd's reaction and Jesus escaping them to continue his teaching and preaching is a foreshadowing of Jesus' death and resurrection and the mission of the Church to continue spreading the Good News.
