God's Word

The word of God today has passages from the Book of Kings and the gospel according to Luke. Both passages speak of children falling sick in one case so severe is the illness that breath had left the child leaving his mother with many questions. The gospel story speaks of the only son of a widow being carried for burial, his mother is overwhelmed by sadness, grief and tears as her neighbours try to support her. Death is a difficult cross to carry but when it is the death of a child the grief is almost unbearable.

Bryan Mc Mahon in his book "The Master" recounts an account of a father bringing his son to school for the first day. One day a small farmer arrived at school holding a strong sturdy child by the hand. There were preliminary greetings details were given and taken. "You see him, the winter morning he was born the doctor came from the room and said, "your wife is ok but the child is gone." Then he left. "I went to the room and saw the blue baby. My wife was out for the count, I took the child in my arms, took him to the fire in the kitchen, rubbed olive oil all over him, I kept turning the child and kept him warm with a little blanket. This went on for a long time, then I heard a gargle, he began to change colour as I kept working, then there was big cry, I realised my child was back alive. Here he is for you Master; I leave him in your good hands."

The story stresses the beauty and joy of life. The great joy in getting life back. You see that joy in a recovering alcoholic and their family and friends. Great joy in people who get their life back and recover from serious illness. Life is a great gift; we can take it for granted, try to welcome life each day as a gift from God. Jesus adds years to the life of the young man in today's gospel and also that He is the source of Eternal life for all who believe.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading 1 Kings 17:17-24
In this very moving and dramatic passage from 1 Kings we hear of how a young boy in the house where the prophet Elijah is staying becomes seriously ill. Understandably, the child's mother wonders if her guest, this 'man of God', is in fact the cause of her son's condition. Elijah takes the child, pleads with God to revive him and returns him safe and well to his mother.

Second Reading Galatians 1:11-19
Paul is eager to demonstrate that he is not a spokesperson for any of the apostles, and that he was not influenced by anyone, other than Jesus himself, prior to, during or after his powerful encounter with the lord on the road to Damascus. Therefore, when he dispenses from traditional legal observances, he does so based on his conviction that this is an integral part of the gospel of Christ.

Gospel Reading Luke 7:11-17
In the era of dedicated news channels, the sight of funeral processions with the bodies of young people killed as a result of war or famine is not unusual. All too frequent, too, are the reports of young people killed in motoring accidents on our roads. No matter what the circumstances, there is always a grieving mother or father, relative or friend. The one response capable of helping in each situation is the one adopted by Jesus in the Gospel today: compassion.
