As we have celebrated the Easter season 2023, we wanted to thank you for your dedication to telling the Trócaire Lent story over the past few weeks, and for the unending generosity shown by your parish.

It's at this time of year that we ask people around the country to return their boxes or donations to their local church or to us directly at trocaire.org.

Since the beginning of Lent, Nasteha and the rest of the Mahat family have continued to receive support from the Trócaire team in Somalia and Nasteha and her siblings have been able to stay in school. However, the humanitarian situation in Somalia is worse than it has ever been, as the Trócaire hospitals and health centres, which already treat 22,000 people every month, are seeing increasing numbers of starving and malnourished families and children every day, as the drought rages on across the country.

Against this backdrop, we are asking the people of Ireland, and of your parish congregation, to return their boxes and donations and continue helping to save lives all over the world. First Reading: Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19

In this speech to the Jews, St. Peter aims primarily that Our Lord is the Messiah whose sufferings were foretold by the Prophet Messiah. He wishes to prove that Jesus, in spite of his crucifixion was the Messiah. Peter consoles the Jews with the thought that they had no idea as to whom they were putting to death. Now, however, they are being told so the time has come for them to ask forgiveness for their sins.

Second Reading: 1 John 2: 1-5

The Apostle urges his readers to be very careful to avoid sin; yet he knows the weakness of human nature and holds out the hope of pardon to the sinner because we have an advocate with the Father, one who intercedes for us and for the whole world. Christ exercises this office of advocate for sinners by continually offering the merits of his passion and death on their behalf.

Gospel: Luke 24: 35-48

When Luke set out to write his Gospel he said that he would put all things 'in order'. With these last words of Jesus he welds together what was foretold in Scripture with the mission of the Apostles in the future. Christ had to suffer for the sins of men but as the Messiah he had to rise again and give to the Apostles the power to forgive sins and bring liberation to mankind.
