Synod Journey



Synod Journey continues, you may remember in the Spring of 2021 we participated by giving our views on the future of the church, now in October the second phase will begin in Rome on the 4th. Pope Francis says there will no Synod without prayer.... A candle will be lit in both churches during the celebration of all Masses and Exposition on a Friday. For further information see the Irish Synodal pathway. There is plenty of information online. Communion participation and Mission are the key aspects. 300 participants will gather in Rome, 120 have been chosen by Pope Francis, of whom there are 54 women, some Bishops, Eastern Church. All participants will have voting rights, a first for the Catholic Church. Please pray for its success. The third phase will be in October 2024.

First Reading: Isaiah 45:1.4-6

The liberation of Jerusalem's exiles is a sovereign act of God through a human instrument. The prophet explicitly identifies Cyrus as the one to affect this liberation. Cyrus is called God's anointed even if the true God was to him an unknown God. Nevertheless, the Israelites saw the hand of God through Cyrus.

Second Reading: 1 Thess 1:1-15

For a young Church faced with persecution, the Thessalonians have given evidence of Christian living, which could be a model for every Christian Church: faith in action, expressed in charity, and enduring with hope. These fundamental virtues express the continuity of past -present-future in Christian life.

Gospel: Mt 22:15-21

Christian life is not divisible into the secular and the sacred, as if things we do for the State have nothing to do with God. Jesus is not thinking of God and Caesar as two powers, who can exact their rights from their subjects. Any system - political, economic, religious, social-as long as they are just reflect the values of the kingdom of God.
