The Season of Advent

Already the Second Sunday of Advent is upon us and December, with its mixture of wind, rain, and frost, is passing by quickly. Last Friday was the beautiful Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. As well as being a religious holiday in honour of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, the 8th of December has traditionally been a day of shopping in anticipation of Christmas. These days, however, the saga of shopping seems to be spread out over several weeks. A daunting task, no doubt.

All the more important, then, were our few days of Advent Retreat last week. For me, they were like an inoculation to the tinselly roller-coaster that December can be. A time apart and away from the rush, whether an evening talk in the church or just some quiet time in our day, can make all the difference. Recently, while visiting some classrooms in Scoil Eoin and Scoil Mhuire, I spoke to the children about Advent and Christmas. After a few minutes of talk about Letters to Santa and the Late Late Toy Show, we settled down to pray about what we were hoping for this Christmas. The responses were striking: peace where there is conflict; health where there is illness; accommodation where there is homelessness; kindness where there is friction; safety where people are travelling, etc. With an opportunity to pause, even 8-year-olds can see the things that matter most in the world.

A further opportunity for us to reflect on how things have been going for us will be the Celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Monday 18th at 19:30 in the Church of Christ Our Light, Innishmore. 'Come to me, all you who labour and are over-burdened, and I will give you rest' (Matthew 11:28). Wishing you every blessing for Advent.
